

Since its establishment in 2009, THN has had considerable successes in developing resources for patients and healthcare professionals in line with its objectives and making optimal use of members' time available to commit to projects.

The vision and mission of THN is to identify solutions and strategies to promote and enhance home dialysis. Our members are committed to driving outcomes aligned with the group's strategy and working towards achieving our overall mission statement, which is: "Through research, education and advocacy, The HOME Network aims to enable healthcare professionals with knowledge and resources to empower more people with chronic kidney disease to embrace the freedom of home dialysis".

Global Recruitment Success – 98% Target Achieved!

Thank you to all the participating PD Units in Australia and New Zealand for their amazing efforts in achieving a 98% recruitment target at the close of the global enrolment on 31 October 2023.

Now, all efforts are continued for participant follow up visits. We are really seeing the end of the tunnel!

The TEACH-PD training curriculum and material have been developed by a core group of renal nurses from the HOME Network (THN) in conjunction with senior medical clinicians from the Australasian Kidney Trials Network (AKTN), eLearning curriculum developers, consumer representatives, and education experts, in line with the ISPD guidelines, utilising modern adult learning principles and best practice eLearning techniques.



- (4) My Chit Chat Time Channel, an online video enterprise demonstrating kidney-friendly meals utilising the resources available through published recipes.



The HOME Network is proud to acknowledge that our Chairperson, Professor Josephine Chow, CF, was awarded the New South Wales Health *2023 Staff Member of the Year* in October 2023.

Professor Chow has been crucial to the global impact of the renal program's knowledge generation in nursing leadership and practices. She is a Winston Churchill Fellow and the Chair of a number of local and international professional and influential committees.

Her leadership sets a positive example, promotes positive cultural change and inspires others.

Professor Chow is the founder and foundational Chair of The HOME Network (since 2009), an Australasian initiative that brings healthcare professionals and consumers together to promote home dialysis as a choice.

Working with the strategic partners, she has considerable success in securing funding for significant international projects including TEACH-PD, PEACH, COVID-19 and Long COVID. In recognition of her innovative response and leadership to the COVID-19 pandemic, Professor Chow was the Finalist of the 2022 Federal Health Minister's award for Nursing Trailblazers. She has received over 30 awards in research, leadership and innovation, such as the NSW Health Innovation Award. She advocates (and is also a member of) consumer working groups. She has affiliations with universities in Australia and the Stanford University in the United States.

Professor Chow holds several foundational positions within NSW Health including:

- Director of Strategy/Partnerships
- Co-Director for the Liverpool Renal Clinical Trial Centre
- Foundational Chair and Professor of the South Western Sydney Nursing & Midwifery Alliance
- Deputy Director of Research, and
- Lead of the Operational Team of the COVID-19 Pandemic Emergency Operation Centre.

This recognition as NSW Health 2023 Staff Member of the Year has further provided a strong symbol signifying the role and works of The HOME Network. Congratulations Professor Chow!

Together, we are working on a brand-new project that will explore even more recipes that promote kidney health. All recipes will be developed in consultation with THN renal dietitians.


